How are the StanCOG Sustainable Community Strategy (SCS)—a regional plan for Stanislaus County and the City of Modesto's General Plan Update related? Sustainable Communities Strategy And General Plan



The SCS and Modesto's General Plan both consider long-term housing, transportation and land use needs, taking a big-picture look at how the City and County can grow over time in a way that uses resources efficiently, protects existing communities, conserves farmland and open space, and supports both health and the economy. Planning in advance of expected growth can result in better neighborhoods, more housing and transportation choices, and a higher quality of life for residents.

The SCS is currently in public review and is anticipated to be adopted this summer – and the City of Modesto has recently formulated their General Plan for a lengthy environmental assessment.

StanCOG and City of Modesto staff will provide graphic presentations and answer questions about planning principles and guiding state requirements, their respective plan recommendations, the processes leading to adoption and implementation, and projected results of these important planning efforts.
